
















GIRL TALK QUARTET 2023 BHS Pioneer District Champions & 2024 SAI Region 2 Champions



Girl Talk Quartet was formed in the spring of 2018 and hails from Mid-Michigan. Girl Talk is the 2023 Pioneer District BHS Quartet Champion as well as the 2024 Region #2 SAI Quartet Champion and represented at the BHS International this summer in Cleveland, OH and will be at the SAI International Competition this fall in Kansas, City, MO.

Staci Slamka sings tenor. Staci first started singing barbershop when she was a teenager, occasionally filling in as tenor during her dad's quartet rehearsals. Staci met her husband, Holli's dad, through barbershop, and he convinced her to audition for her first Sweet Adelines quartet in 2001. That's when her quartet journey officially began. During the week, Staci works as a psychologist for the Hillsdale Intermediate School District.

Holli Houtz is the lead, and she is a 4th generation barbershopper! Holli also makes learning tracks, coaches, sings with 2023 SAI Rising Star winning quartet, Cosmic, and co-directs MI-X chorus. In her non-barbershop time, Holli enjoys pet sitting, teaching voice lessons, and occasionally having down time with her husband and pets.

Kathryn Summers is the baritone of Girl Talk. She has been singing barbershop since 2006, and is a first generation barbershopper. Her day job includes nonpartisan budget crunching for the Michigan legislature and in her non-singing hobby time, she enjoys thrifting at garage sales and flea markets. Kathryn attended her first BHS convention in 2008 and was hooked even more to this 'hobby' that is so far beyond a hobby.

Kendra LaPointe, bass of Girl Talk, is a 2nd generation barbershop singer. Her parents, husband and all 3 sons are active barbershoppers and even sing together as a family. Kendra was the tenor of the 2006 SAI International Champion Quartet, SPOTLIGHT. In her spare time she enjoys home DIY projects, coaching, singing in the Motor City Blend SAI chorus and spending time with family.

Barbershop Voice Parts and Function

Tenor is the highest part, harmonizing above the Lead. Notated in the top stave, Tenor stems always point up. Tenor singers should have a light, lyric vocal quality. Male tenors usually sing this part in falsetto, and should be approximately 10% of the sound. This is radically different than most musical performance styles, because the melody is NOT in this top voice.

Lead is the second highest part, singing the melody. Notated in the top stave, Lead stems always point down. Lead singers should be prominent and have a dramatic and compelling vocal quality, and should be approximately 30% of the sound. This is different than most musical performance styles, because the melody is in the second voice down. This "melody from inside" gives us the characteristic barbershop sound.

Baritone sings above and below the Lead. Notated in the bottom stave, Baritone stems always point up. Baritone singers should have a lyric vocal quality, and should be approximately 20% of the sound. The baritone should sing louder when below the lead, and softer when above the lead. The unusual voice leading can be very challenging, especially to the novice barbershop Baritone.

Bass is the lowest part, singing foundational notes. Notated in the bottom stave, Bass stems always point down. The Bass part should be as prominent as the Lead, with a big, robust vocal quality, and should be approximately 40% of the sound.





Society Code of Ethics

We shall refrain from forcing our songs upon unsympathetic ears.

We shall refrain from taking improper advantage of our membership and BHS fellowship for personal gain.

We shall not permit political, religious, or other controversial issues to hinder or inhibit the enjoyment of barbershop harmony.

We shall, through our service to the Barbershop Harmony Society, endeavor to spread the spirit of barbershop harmony throughout the world.
